About the Instructor

Gary Weeter is both an architect and an artist. Before retiring in 2003, he maintained his architectural practice in Dallas, Texas. Gary and his wife Elaine now reside in Hot Springs Village, Arkansas and enjoy traveling around the world. For the past ten years, he has taught watercolor classes for passengers aboard the Crystal Cruise Lines as part of their “Odyssey Art at Sea” enrichment program. Many of his paintings are from photos taken of interesting scenery while on these cruises. He has taught a number of watercolor workshops for Brush Strokes Art Club.

Gary has been actively engaged in watercolor painting since the mid-1970’s. His paintings are in many private collections in the Southwestern United States. He is a Signature Member of both the Southwestern Watercolor Society and Mid-Southern Watercolorists, a prestigious recognition by these groups for his demonstrated mastery in watercolor. He has studied under internationally known watercolor artists, including John Pike, Edgar Whitney, Sterling Edwards and Joseph Fettingis. He has also studied under the noted Hot Springs watercolorist Richard Stephens.

Workshop Overview

In this workshop, students will learn various techniques and appropriate color pigments to depict three of the primary seasons of the year. From subject matter provided by the instructor, all students will paint the same picture. The instructor will use a “step by step” approach to demonstrate the sequence of developing the painting. Students will essentially “paint along with the instructor” to complete their paintings. Each student will complete three paintings during the workshop, depicting three seasons of the year: winter, summer and fall.

There will be a half-hour lunch break each day. It is suggested that students bring a “brown bag” lunch due to the short lunch break. A refrigerator and microwave are available.
